Artist Dick Davison: “Monuments” Exhibition Heavenly Architecture – Concepts and Constructions

Where does God dwell? Have you ever thought about the architecture of the ‘first’ house, the home of Adam and Eve? What is the architecture of heavenly places? Is it possible for humans to create art that reflects these different places? Take the classical interpretations of Palladio and Piranesi, combine them with the contemporary perspectives of Tim Burton and H. R. Giger, then you will begin to understand the work of artist Dick Davison.

Professor of Architecture at Texas A&M University in College Station, Dick Davison’s work will be featured in a new exhibition opening on April 14th at The MBA Museum of Biblical Art in Dallas. An art talk is scheduled for 2 PM that afternoon with an opportunity to meet the artist.

“The visible world, reality as we perceive it with our eyes, is indeed a great mystery. The more one pursues the understanding of things visual, the more one is awed by the subtlety and complexity of visual reality as well as the apparatus (namely the eye and brain) that process that information” according to Davison. Museum Curator Scott Peck says that “Davison’s work is fresh and bright. These are ‘mindscapes’, each is a religious journey. Fantasy and science fiction-like imagery collide with deep theological principles; you feel as if you are exploring other realms, the realms of the spirit world and dimensions of the multi-verse.”


